



**AIM Harvest Summary: Weeks of 5/14 and 5/21**

**3 person crew (2 divers)**

### **Week 1**

The crew started work in Little Square Bay swimming the entire littoral area of the bay. Nearly 300 small milfoil plants were removed from the shallows normally dominated by lily pads later in the season. The extended shallow area known as the “tongue” yielded nearly a full bag of plants averaging about three feet in height with lots of fragments scattered around them.

Pork Bay was covered next and produced only 49 plants most out in deeper water along the littoral zone dropoff. Gilpin Bay came next and yielded only 21 plants. Lastly, the crew finished the week by doing an early swim of Fish Creek Pond and removed a total of 45 scattered plants from the entire area.

### **Week 2**

The crew started with Pelky Bay in order to clear it out before Young Life got active. Part of Bungalow Bay was also covered. These areas produced 1 full bag.

The crew covered Square Bay, removing about ½ of a bag of plants. They were typically very small, only a few inches in height although some larger plants were also harvested near the dropoff with lots of surrounding fragments and small plants. Next, the South Basin, the bays Northeast and Northwest of it and the shoreline heading North past Camp Wenonah and stopping just Southwest of Deer Island were covered and produced ¼ of a bag in scattered growth.

Lastly the crew swam the entire littoral area around Buck Island including the small bay Northeast of the Island. The only area not covered was from the center of the channel to the Eastern shoreline. ¼ of a bag was removed.
